AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FALMOUTH, IN PENDLETON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2021 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022, BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES, AND APPROPIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FALMOUTH, PENDLETON COUNTY, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS: **SECTION 1:** The annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, more particularly described in the attached Exhibits, is hereby adopted as attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. This Ordinance shall be effective as of Aug 10, 2021 **SECTION 2: SECTION 3:** The Invalidity of any section of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other section. **SECTION 4:** This Ordinance shall be published in Summary according to law. The foregoing Ordinance was read, passed, and adopted by the **SECTION 5:** Council of the City of Falmouth, Kentucky, meeting in regular session on the 20 day of Tuly 2021, and in special session on the 3 day of August 2021.
